EAL and SEND: cracking the conundrum

This course looks at the overlap between working with English as an additional language learners and learners with special educational needs. It considers the different types of learners and explores how professionals might distinguish between pupils' language needs and pupils' learning difficulties. It demonstrates effective provision for pupils who are learning English as an additional language and whose progress may be causing concern.

The course also explores appropriate assessment procedures and provision.



What you will gain by attending the course:

- an understanding of the difference between learning an additional language needs and learning difficulties
- an effective informal first language assessment procedure
- examples of innovative and inclusive teaching styles across the curriculum

The course:

- introduces the different types of learners and explores ways of distinguishing EAL learning from learning difficulties
- · provides procedures for assessing pupils' needs
- provides strategies and approaches that will empower staff to employ inclusive practice across the curriculum
- offers ways to ensure that provision matches the learning needs of both individual pupils and groups

Course leader:

Marc Thompson is a specialist in special educational needs, inclusion, and the learning needs of pupils learning English as an Additional Language. Marc was previously Head of EAL in a London school and later Deputy Head of an EMA centre. His particular areas of expertise are the SEN/EAL overlap, boys' and promoting boys' reading.



Parking at South Hill Centre

South Hill Centre has its own car park with a limited number of spaces available. Unfortunately there will not be enough spaces available for your event. Individuals attending this event are therefore encouraged to walk, come via public transport or car share where possible. Limited short term pay and display parking is available on Cemetery Hill. Parking for this event will be at neighbouring public car parks, within short walking distance of the Centre. These are shown on the map below. Long stay (more than 4hr) parking is on the lower deck of the Watergardens (N) car park. Public Car parks cost around 80p-£1 for 1hr; up to £2.50 for 4 hrs and around £3.50 for the whole day. Additional free parking areas may be available, on request, for evening and weekend bookings.



NEW Togetherall online wellbeing support for anyone aged 16+

GET SUPPORT WITH TOGETHERALL IN HERTS 24/7 Hertfordshire County Council Public Health recently launched Togetherall, a resource that may be useful for sixth form students, parents/carers and school staff.

Togetherall is an evidence-based, clinically moderated, online 24/7 peer-to-peer mental health community, for residents of Hertfordshire who may be feeling low or depressed. It can also help prevent mental ill health with a range of support, courses and advice, and with the additional benefit of professionals monitoring for any signs of distress.

Wellbeing and Mental Health Program in UK Secondary Schools

Govox - https://www.govox.com/ are seeking to work with secondary schools in Hertfordshire and have introduced a wellbeing and mental health programme to support schools to halt the increase in teenage suicide rates. Govox states:

- The new £5m scheme from Govox Wellbeing backed by the Government and Education Secretary will allow secondary schools to monitor the wellbeing of pupils and offer support
- The programme is being rolled out free-of-charge in up to 1,000 schools and 1m pupils in its first year (* see notes below) and is aimed at saving and improving the lives of young people
- Developed in collaboration with experts including King's College London and NHS, and supported by charities including Mind In Mid Herts, Mental Health Foundation and Papyrus, the programme highlights at-risk pupils



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• The service is vitally needed - suicide amongst teenagers has increased by nearly 50% in the past decade, whilst 1 in 14 children have attempted suicide by the age of 17 This is an organisation outside of Hertfordshire County Council and schools are advised to do carry out their own research to ensure this programme is suitable for them.

There are a few things schools should be aware of: Notes

- * Schools need to be aware that the 'free' element is applicable for one year only; thereafter there will be a cost for this programme. Schools should ensure that they are able to continue to fund this support for any young person for the duration of the time they need support.
- * Schools should consider whether they have the resource to support any student they identify as requiring additional support, and what are the onward clinical pathways/wrap arounds including clinical staff supervision.

<u>Update from Hertfordshire Community NHS Trust (HCT) Regarding Speech and</u> Language Therapy (SaLP)

An update from Hertfordshire Community NHS Trust (HCT) regarding Speech and Language Therapy (SaLT) provision.

HCT's Children and Young People's Integrated Therapy (CYPT) Service operates a Speech and Language Therapies Service (SaLT) for children and young people across Hertfordshire. This service is commissioned by Hertfordshire County Council (HCC). HCT have been in discussion with HCC about a prioritisation tool to be used for all the children on the SaLT caseload. Currently children are prioritised by the length of time they have waited and if they have an Education and Health Care Plan (EHCP), as opposed to clinical need.

As agreed with HCC, HCT will now conduct a clinical review of all children who are currently receiving therapy from the SaLT service or who are currently on our waiting list for intervention. This will allow HCT to establish a clear picture of the needs of the children on its caseload and prioritise resources for children based on an up-to-date understanding of their current clinical needs. It will also allow HCT to review whether children are accessing the most appropriate tier of the service based on their individual needs. This review process was piloted in the Watford area last year and is now to be rolled out across the county.

This process will result in a pause in business-as-usual activities from 18th July – 29th July 2022, while our therapists undertake clinical reviews. We appreciate that while this is a temporary change, we want to minimise its impact on schools and families and ensure that the outcome is one where every child is able to receive the right care for their needs, provided in a fair order of priority based on clinical need.

Below we have provided the answers to some of the questions we expect your teaching staff will have. How will the clinical reviews be carried out? Our therapists will undertake two types of assessment as part of this process:

- 1. Children who are currently receiving interventions or whose initial assessment took place within the last three months will have a paper-based review by a therapist, using the information we already have which will reflect their current situation.
- 2. Children who have been on the waiting list for more than three months will be offered a face-to-face session with a therapist, at a HCT clinic. This will allow us to update their records with an accurate overview of their current needs and situation. No in-person sessions will take place on school premises.

In all cases, children will be prioritised using a standardised set of criteria that will assess the impact of their individual issue(s) on their development and day-to-day life and whether SaLT interventions offer the most suitable and/or most urgently required solution versus other specialist interventions.

What happens after the clinical reviews are complete? There are four possible outcomes for each child after all clinical reviews are complete

- 1. If there is no change in the child's needs and/or situation that first brought them to SaLT, they will remain on the HCT SaLT caseload or waiting list with the aim to offer therapy in order of clinical priority.
- 2. If the child's clinical needs are more urgent now than at their initial assessment, they will be categorised as a higher priority case, and vice versa. They will remain on the HCT SaLT caseload or waiting list with the aim to offer therapy in order of clinical priority.
- 3. If the child's clinical needs can be met more effectively by another service, they will be transferred to that service and discharged. You will be made aware of this by receipt of a discharge letter.
- 4. If the child's clinical needs are resolved to a level where they no longer require clinical support from SaLT and/or another service, they will be discharged. There are many non-HCT providers who offer different types of interventions which may be more suitable for the child and we will advise you of these. You will be made aware of this by receipt of a discharge letter.

What is the timeline for this project?

We expect the majority of our clinical reviews to take place from 18th July – 29th July 2022. We have paused our usual timetabling of appointments for this period to ensure we do not have to make any cancellations. Business-as-usual activities will resume after 29th July 2022.

What does this mean for interventions that usually take place in schools?

We have deliberately chosen to begin this prioritisation process in the last week of the summer term to minimise the disruption to SaLT activities that usually take place at schools during term-time hours. However, due to the volume of clinical reviews needed, we will not be holding any school-based sessions during the last week of the summer term.

How will we communicate with families?

In addition to sending this letter to every school, we are also writing to every parent and/or carer of children who are receiving services from us or are on our waiting list. This letter will explain the review process and how it may impact on their child. Follow up text messages will also be sent.

For those children who will need a face-to-face session as part of this process, parents and/or carers will be invited by a follow up text to book an appointment.





