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FEELING GOOD WEEK – FEBRUARY 2023

This year the theme is Be Kind and Connect. You are invited to apply for up to £500 to deliver ideas that promote interpersonal relationships and kindness so that children and young people can socialise within their communities to support mental health and emotional wellbeing.

Feeling Good Week is a Hertfordshire-wide event that encourages schools and the wider community to promote children and young people's emotional wellbeing by raising awareness of mental health and showing where support can be accessed within the community.

From **6th- 10th February 2023**, we want you to help make children and young people in Hertfordshire feel good by running your own special projects to boost their emotional and mental wellbeing.

Youth organisations, schools, and young people are invited to submit a bid and apply for up to £500 of funding, which has been put forward by Hertfordshire County Council. The bids will be reviewed by a panel in December, and they will decide which projects will receive funding.

To apply please complete the **application form**.

The deadline for applications is: Friday 2nd December 2022

Please note, only one application per organisation will be accepted. In the event that applications are over-subscribed and in line with tackling health inequalities, Feeling Good Week projects funding will prioritise applications from areas of deprivation within the county. Healthy Relationships & Sexual Assault For more information and to book a session email: hello@trcic.co.uk 小 **STARTING CONVERSATIONS TODAY** hthulb HEALTHY **RELATIONSHIPS &** SEXUAL ASSAULT WHAT WILL IT COVER? WHAT IS IT? The session will cover how to recognise unhealthy behaviours within relationships and in ourselves. The Lightbulb project also educates young people about what consent looks like, and what to do if you have been sexually assaulted. The Lightbulb Project is a one-and-a-half-hour educational session appropriate for Year 11, 12, and 13 on Healthy Relationships & Sexual Assault. WHO DELIVERS IT? The session is created and delivered by the Trauma The session is created and delivered by the Trauma Recovery CIC team who is commissioned by the NHS to provide trauma psychotherapy in Hertfordshire, Cambridgeshire, and Bedfordshire. Our team brings together qualified psychotherapists with experience in relational trauma, social work and domestic abuse and safeguarding. We are also registered with the National Counselling Society. WHAT ARE THE COSTS? Nothing. Our pilot at a Hertfordshire Secondary School generated such positive feedback from 16– 18-year-olds (recording 100% 'Good'/oer yGood' on the i) workshop experience ii) content of the workshop and iii) presentation / delivery – that we have secured funding from the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner to roll-out additional sessions across the county at no cost to schools. However, resources are limited and the sessions will be offered on a first come, first served basis. **IS IT NEEDED?** According to the Crime Survey for England & Wales, year ending March 2018 to March 2020 combined, men and women aged 16 to 24 years were more likely to be victims of sexual assault in the last year than those aged 25 years and over. In addition, ful-time students were more likely to have experienced sexual assault in the last year than people in any other occupation type. It is more important than ever before that we invest in programmes to educate, inform and support young people in recognising harmful behaviours within relationships and how to seek out support. **DATES & TIMING** We will be offering 9am to 10.30am or 1.30pm to 3pm sessions during the w/c 27th March 2023 and again in the summer w/c 3rd July 2023. New Free Youth Wellbeing Service for Herts

New free service to help young people manage their worries.

With YOUth - Children & Young People's Digital Wellbeing Service

Hertfordshire's children and young people, who are experiencing emotional health problems and/or their parents/care givers, can now use a new free digital wellbeing service, without the need for a professional referral.

Asking for advice and help early, is the healthy, safe and positive choice for having good emotional and mental wellbeing – far better than trying to cope alone with worry and overwhelming feelings.

This new free service is for children and young people aged 5-18, who are registered with a GP in Hertfordshire. It will initially be available from Monday to Friday, 2-10pm at: <u>www.withyouth.org</u> providing:

Instant online messaging

 Lumi Nova (most suitable for ages 7-12) - therapeutic digital gaming app providing goal based help for social/separation anxiety and/or phobias, using the most beneficial parts of Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT). Access via the link is instant (no referral needed)

Worksheets, quick tips and other resources to help

Additional one-to one and/or group support

Signposting to other services

The With YOUth team can help with problems such as mild to moderate anxiety, behavioural difficulties, school attendance, low mood, relationship difficulties, bullying or self-harm. The service is not for children and young people who are in crisis*.

With YOUth/Lumi Nova is part of Hertfordshire's Children and Adolescent Mental Health Services (CAMHS) System Redesign Programme. The Programme has made an ongoing commitment to improving access to emotional and mental wellbeing support at the earliest point.
